

The length of a submission should not exceed 12 pages, using the page size format of a proceedings published in the Springer's Lecture Notes in Computer Science series (prepared with `l1ncs` document class for $\text{\LaTeX}2\epsilon$).

In tracks with more theoretically oriented profiles, where results may be formulated as lemmas or theorems, the authors may find that the complete formal mathematical proofs, needed to substantiate the main claims of the paper, will not fit into the submission to the length limitation. For the purpose of reviewing, such proofs may form a clearly marked appendix, placed at the very end, within a single file. Such appendix is optional, it is not a part of the paper, and it will be taken into consideration only at the discretion of the Programme Committee. An appendix used for other purposes may be ignored completely. Moreover, submissions deviating significantly from these guidelines risk rejection without consideration of their merits.

The page limit and page format of papers for the Student Research Forum are the same. To be eligible, all authors of the paper must be students, except possibly for their advisors. (However, the main author should be a student. It is also assumed that the presentation at the conference will be given by a student.)

Simultaneous submissions to any other conferences with published proceedings are not allowed.

Before sending your submission

You will need to prepare the following material:

(1) A plain text file containing (1.a) your identification, that is, name(s) of all author(s), their address(es), email(s), and fax number(s), with clearly marked corresponding author, (1.b) title of your contribution, a 'reasonably short' abstract, and a list of keywords.

(Deadline: August 22, 2007)

(2) Either a `*.pdf` or a `*.ps` output containing your paper, including also an optional appendix for the Program Committee. (The use of MS Word `*.doc` files is also possible, but not recommended, by Springer-Verlag.)

(Deadline: August 28, 2007)
